RHCS D projects

- Laurie/ Scott Rajczi (facilities director) conversation “they have done an audit”
  - Denis: give Sunrise, e.g., more leverage in these decisions and how the school should move forward. Sunrise can also hold school/TetraTech accountable to the community request that projects are climate-informed.
  - Stellan has also asked at school board meetings, 3x this winter. No emails in response as promised.

- Denis / Geo Tech conference
- New York State: all electric buses (2035?)
  - Jen: School presented at last Village Board meeting. Right now, focus is on unleaded buses, some propane buses. EV buses cost 3x more without infrastructure yet, but could be useful for most uses (once required).
  - Steve pointed out that schools are held to state education department.
- Ben Hoen / solar project (invited/ has a conflict)
  - ~1MW system across 3 buildings - one more approval needed and hope to do summer construction. He connected with Brian Boyd about curricular connections including not just the tech part but also climate ‘hope’
  - Ben wants curricular connection within the school district, e.g. a tech class.
  - Jen: Was there a Direct Energy demonstration solar panel? Denis says SunCommon does have a roadshow trailer with solar panels. School solar is Solar Liberty (Buffalo).

**Materials Management - *oh what a month!* \*\***

  - Why: to keep things out of the landfill, restore broken items to use, build community

  - Biggest challenge: reaching people with local events. The Daily Catch last-minute outreach seemed to work pretty well.

## Planning Board

Code changes: Battery Energy Storage, Solar Updates/Agrivoltaics, Stretch Energy Code (Items referred to Energy Cte)

Denis: need to understand the intersection between Energy Cte and CAC.

Used to be a task force, now a committee with three overlapping members.

Projects vs. topics: As Energy Committee branches off, CAC: pollinators, water, land

Denis: e.g. current task = promoting heat pumps, research needed.

Climate Action Plan from 2012: 20% GHG reduction by 2020. Did we achieve? We don't know. We need to revisit, refresh the inventory of e.g. how many people are using boilers. Setting new goals.

Laurie: This is an opportunity to gather info we need for two things: Climate Action Plan and for heat pump push. This can be an assignment. Keep eyes out for new Climate Action Plan grant in the meantime, address the pieces now.

Lori: it's also driven by the numbers and interests of the committee.

Denis sees a priority in our community to change local government: proactively getting good things done.

## Land & Water

### Pollinator possibilities

- Town Hall and/or Bard
  - Partners for Climate Action Hudson Valley reviewed sites
  - Town site was disrupted by septic construction, might not set great grant baseline. But regardless of grant - do a native pollinator planting while the space is torn up already.
- Village Pollinator garden update? outside fence of solar field, kiosk, Abrahams or Memorial park
  - Open Space Initiative pollinator pathway through the village, outside the solar farm (SunCommon doesn't allow within), Community Center event to make own garden at home. May 28th.
  - Art Boxes: opportunity for conversation about land practices related to pollinator pathway appropriateness

CAC unanimously recommended that Town Board pass a resolution in support of CLCPA (from Jen Metzger to Denis to pass on). Was not brought up at last night's Town Board meeting.

### Transportation

  - Where does the maintenance fall once bikes and charging infrastructure are here? (To have company operating it does not seem cost-effective). Complete Streets?
- May is Bike Month
  - Village Bike rodeo (Jen)
  - Share Bike Rodeo information. Full event more than drop-in: first test bikes for safety then take on a ride.
